3. OBJECTIVES AND CONTENT

3.1. Course objectives (including the form of classes) O1. Teaching Russian through the comprehensive development of all language skills. O2. Mastery of the Russian alphabet, basic pronunciation and intonation patterns, and basic spelling conventions. O3. Developing basic knowledge of Russian vocabulary, spelling and grammar.
3.2. Course content (including the form of classes) - The Russian alphabet in printed and handwritten forms (correct pronunciation and stress), reading and writing individual words and expressions. - Self-presentation. Greetings. Polite expressions. - Making acquaintances in formal and informal situations. Introducing family members and friends. - Daily routine, university activities/work, free time and interests. - At the shop (food products and basic goods). - Cuisine. Meals (at home, in a restaurant and fast-food establishments). Traditional Russian and Polish dishes. - House and flat. Describing rooms and furnishings. - Using public transport, at the airport, in a hotel and at a public office. Basic personal information. Documents. Forms. - Tourism and transport. Types of tourism. Booking trips, accommodation and tickets. Describing a country, a city and their tourist attractions. - People. Physical appearance and character traits. - Work. Occupations. - Grammar: nouns, adjectives and pronouns; declension by case; correct pronunciation (stress and intonation); questions; verb conjugation; cardinal numbers from 1 to 100; ordinal numbers. Syntactic differences.
